Select, fit and evaluate a range of specialist tack

Understand the principles of nutrition, fittening and horse physiology

Demonstrate how to assess the conformation and health of horses

Understand how to care for different groups of horses

Understand the foaling process and the care of mares, foals and young stock

Understand the importance of customer care and how to apply this in your business

Demonstrate effective interpersonal skills

Understand the responsibilities of a yard manager, including managing staff, accounts and record keeping

Understand how to manage a yard, including marketing, facilities and grassland management

#### What comes next?

Learners could progress onto undertaking the external BHS Stage 4 assessment or apply to attend one of our full time equine courses.
