the RSPCA, Veterinary Sector, Environment Agency, Local Government, Trading Standards, Police, Armed Forces and Teaching. Our Animal Health and Welfare Degree will introduce you to advances in welfare practices.

The 120 credit course will include:

A university-led research module  
Vertebrate zoology  
Animal ethics and welfare  
Advances in animal health and behaviour  
Advanced clinical nutrition.

Lecturers include Bethan Lewis, Kate Beavan RVN, Rhiannon Stundon RVN, Michelle Cooper, Jess Ingleson and Clare Clift RVN.

Assessment will be varied and ongoing through the year-long course to include group discussion and critiques, investigation projects, portfolio work, presentations, practical assessment and reports.

On completion, you'll achieve a BSc (Hons) Animal Health and Welfare.

### **What is expected of me?**

The BSc (Hons) Animal Health and Welfare (Top Up) Degree is Year 3 entry only. A pass in the Foundation Degree in Animal Health and Welfare at Coleg Gwent, or one of the University Of South Wales' Partner Colleges is required. Applicants with Foundation Degrees in similar subject areas will be considered on an individual basis.

The usual timetable for this course runs over one/two days per week and students will be expected to attend all sessions. There will be an expectation for students to complete at least 20 hours per week of independent study and research. Some teaching sessions will be held at USW Glyntaff Campus, Pontypridd, although most will be delivered from Coleg Gwent's Usk Campus.

### **What comes next?**

A graduate position based in an agricultural industry, such as the RSPCA, Veterinary Sector, Environment Agency, Local Government, Trading Standards, Police, Armed Forces and Teaching.
