What is expected of me?

There are no formal entry requirements, but you'll need to be motivated, hardworking and willing to have a go at each of the vocational options. You'll also need to be committed to full attendance and being punctual for all sessions. Students that choose this route may have

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achieved GCSEs at Grades D-G and some may have achieved higher but be uncertain about the route they want to study.
