What is expected of me?

You'll need a minimum of 5 GCSEs at Grade C or above, to include either Maths/Maths Numeracy or English/Welsh First Language, or an appropriate Level 2 Diploma qualification at Merit Grade.

You need to have a keen interest in music and have the enthusiasm and drive to develop your practical skills. Full commitment to attendance is required, as well as respect for others, enthusiasm for the subject and self-motivation. You should also have the enthusiasm and positive attitude that future employers will be looking for.

There's an expectation that you'll continue your studies and coursework during your own time. You'll also be expected to attend as many events as possible and network with as many people as you can.

What comes next?

You could progress to a music-related course at university or enter employment in areas such as live sound, lighting, AMP or Drum Tech or performing at semi-pro level.
