This course will give you an introduction to the world of music industry, performance and technology.

What will I be doing?

You will complete project work through a variety of performance, written-work, blogs, vlogs and interactive media.

You will study 6 units:

What is expected of me?

To enrol, you'll need a minimum of 4 GCSEs Grade D or above to include either Maths/Maths Numeracy or English/Welsh First Language, or an appropriate Level 1 Diploma qualification in the relevant vocational area, to include either GCSE Maths/Maths Numeracy or English/Welsh First Language grade.

You will be expected to play an instrument, or sing, in order to take part in performance weeks.

Full commitment to attendance is required, as well as respect for others, enthusiasm for the subject, self-motivation, creative ability and a desire to succeed. You'll need an interest in performing arts and modern music development.
