There's a range of courses and qualifications you can study with us that all lead to you reaching the career you want. Not sure which pathway is best for you? Check out the options available for you at Coleg Gwent:

A levels

A levels are ideal for those thinking about going to university (as most courses require specific A levels) or if you're still unsure what career you want. You normally study three or more subjects over the course of two years, which is mainly assessed by exams. A levels are suited to students who prefer academic learning.

Apprenticeships

Already in a job or want to earn while you learn? By applying for an apprenticeship, you'll be employed but given time (usually one day a week) to study a formal qualification related to that job, in college or elsewhere. You can study an apprenticeship in sectors such as engineering, IT, business and health care amongst others.

Vocational courses

Want to work in a trade? Do you prefer learning outside the classroom? Then vocational courses are for you! They help you gain the specific skills needed for the job. 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Why should my child attend Coleg Gwent?
