

Usk campus

Our rural centre. Usk campus is home to our agricultural, sport and leisure and public services courses. Surrounded by beautiful countryside and set on the edge of the historic Usk town, it's the campus to choose if you have a passion for nature and the outdoors. New facilities on site include a state-ofthe-art Learning Centre and a student café.
