If you're a sociable, chatty and creative person who likes to make people feel good about themselves, then Hairdressing and Beauty Therapy is for you! From the top to the bottom of the body, you can learn techniques and skills in treatments such as styling, pedicures and waxing.

Take a look at the different career paths you could follow:

Hairdressing

From cutting and colouring to stylish updos, express your imagination in hair. You'll have an eye for design, advising clients on the look that best suits. You can work your way to become senior stylist or technician.

Beauty Therapy

Pampering and preening the customer, you'll use your know-how of skin biology and cosmetic chemistry to tailor treatments to a client's needs. You'll also advise on aftercare and suitable products. Jobs are found in salons, department stores and mobile services etc.

Complementary Therapies

Also known as holistic therapy, you'll promote healthy living, wellbeing and mindfulness through treatments such as Indian head massage, aromatherapy and hydrotherapy. Suitable for people who are calm and composed.

Theatrical Make Up

As a make-up artist, you are responsible for applying makeup and styling hair for people appearing in films, television programmes, photo shoots or live events like concerts, plays or fashion shows. Hairdressing plays a big part of this course and the industry employs multi-talented individuals who are able to apply makeup and style hair in one shoot.

Special effects makeup artists work with live models or performers to transform them into characters or creatures (usually for the purposes of an act or a play as described in film and TV scripts). Their work involves applying makeup and/or prosthetics to achieve the desirable theatrical effect.
